

D-LIBRARY Iuav – Copyright policies

Italian regulations on copyright (law no. 633 , 22 April 1941, successively modified and integrated) provides tutorship for all inventive works of intellect which belong to literature, science, music and arts.

Moral and economic right (copyright) are applied to the work as it is created with no obligation for the author to register it.

The publication of a work through a institutional deposit like D-library guarantees the intellectual property and the publication date of one's own works and does not limit the possibility for the author to publish and distribute all his/her works through different means.

All documents contained in D-library are protected by copyright, and no re-use of them is possible without the author's permission.

The modalities of diffusion on the net and the level of access to all documents are decided by the author when he/she deposits them in D-library. Documents deposited can be accessed online only for personal purposes, for reasons of study, research or didactics, and cannot be reproduced or published for commercial purposes, neither can their content be modified without the author's permission.

D-library does not verify the scientific content of the documents. The author is the only responsible for such content.

When the author deposits a document, he/she keeps the full intellectual property and all moral and economic rights, unless he/she has transferred them to a publisher.

For such reason, before proceeding to the self-archiving in D-library, the author of a document which has been or is being published must assure that the contract signed with the publisher allows the deposit of the electronic version of the work.

Pre-prints, unpublished works or works which have not been submitted to a journal, can be deposited by the author.

In case the author has submitted all rights to the publisher and does not intend to re-negotiate the agreement, a pre-print or a previous version of such document can be deposited.

The author does not have necessarily to submit all rights to the publisher to publish. So it is convenient for the author to decide to sign a contract which permits the publication online of the works through the self-archiving and, more in general, which permits the re-use of the works for conferences, didactics, etc.
