At the end of the selection process, the Italian Ministry for University and Research (MUR) will verify the eligibility of the projects and the Italian National Agency for the Evaluation of Universities and Research Institutes (ANVUR) will verify the compliance with the requirements of Ministerial Decree no. 118/2023. Whether these checks are positively completed, MUR allocates the funding to the University. The assignment of scholarships referred to in this project is therefore to be considered "with condition" of the positive evaluation of both consistency and eligibility and the allocation of ministerial funds.

### The revocation of the scholarship applies in the following cases:

- a) the Ph.D. programme is realised in a different way from the project admitted to funding, if the necessary authorisation from the MUR has not been requested beforehand and subsequently granted;
- b) failure to complete the Ph.D. course (three-year duration) with reference to the minimum period of study and research at the company or abroad.

#### Specific obligations of Ph.D. candidates

In addition to the requirements established in the Regulations of the Doctoral School of Università luav applicable to all Ph.D. candidates, and in compliance with the rules of Ministerial Decree no. 118/2023, Ph.D. candidates in the framework of the present call must also undertake to:

- submit a report on a six-month basis with the timesheet of their activities (organized by month spent at the company, the research centre, at a Public Administration, abroad) and a summary of the most important tasks, also stating that these tasks are in compliance with the principle of "Do no significant harm". The reporting will be performed through an online platform using the template provided;
- complete the required mandatory periods of study and research at the company and abroad as in the table above:
- guarantee the respect of the obligations in terms of communication and information as provided by the art. 34 of Regulation (EU) 2021/241, indicating in all the documents that the Programme is funded in the frame of the RRP, with explicit reference to the funding by the European Union and the NextGenerationEU initiative, including in the papers the EU logo, and also suitably share and promote the Programme online and on social media in line with what provided by the Communication Strategy of the RRP.
- respect the principle of not doing significant harm (DNSH) to environment, in accordance with Article 17 of Regulation (EU) 2020/852.

### Priority will be given to the following research themes:

Mission 4 Component 1 Investment 3.4 - scholarships dedicated to digital and environmental transitions; Doctoral thesis projects aimed at investigating innovative technologies for the preservation of the natural and built environment in the framework of the ecological transition. Aim of the projects will be to explore sustainable, circular, bio- and nature-based strategies to innovate building processes and construction systems, also using digital and/or monitoring IoT systems, to support energy efficiency, decarbonization, mitigation and adaptation to Climate Change with a particular focus on the interaction between the design project outcome and the protection of fragile environmental contexts or those characterized by social and cultural value of the Italian territory.

## Mission 4 Component 1 Investment 4.1 - scholarships dedicated to PNRR topics

- Declaratory for PNRR research fellowship, XXXIX course, research area: architectural composition The selected thesis projects will be those that have the architecture and its value declinations in the dialectic relation with the city and with the culture of our time as research topic, intended both in a material meaning and immaterial.

The research should highlight the relations between cultural fields – even in similar interdisciplinary contexts – referring to the study of the contemporary city and, in particular, to the theories and procedures of construction of an operational thought for intervention on new landscapes. The research work should explore the complicated relation between tradition and innovation, between continuity and experimentation in the modern and contemporary condition.

The thesis project should be able to explain, already in the presentation phase, original and significant aspects to be investigated, with respect to the historiographical, geographical and cultural framework of the chosen topic.









	- Thesis projects that are oriented at investigating the construction of contemporary cities and territories faced with major challenges and the current role of urbanism, trying to build a background of research and theoretical reflection relevant for analytical and design practices related to urbanism.	
	- Research projects aimed at the study and interpretation of the cultural heritage concerning typeface design, with the goal of reconstructing, by means of primary sources, little-explored and original events in the history of the artefacts that determined the development of the typeface design process, its applications and results in the graphic arts. The study and research period abroad will take place in archival or museum facilities with holdings relating to the history of typography. The study and research period in Italy will be held at the Fondazione Tipoteca Italiana (Tif), the largest Italian museum-archives dedicated to printing and typography.	
	- Thesis projects dealing with the analysis of the effect of degradation on the performance of existing reinforced concrete structures and infrastructure using analytical formulations and numerical modeling. In particular, projects concerning reinforcement corrosion and the evaluation of its effects under both ultimate and service conditions, also considering the variability of environmental factors as a result of ongoing climate change	
	- Research project planned within the field of Visual and Performative arts and Fashion design, conceived in synergy with the aims of the Italian PNRR, must start from the idea sustainability, in relation with all the ways in which these disciplines have already widely developed this topic: respect and mimesis of natural processes, from the human world to the vegetal one following an interspecist perspective; assumption of the climat as an hyper-object with which the humankind has already interfered, causing unbalanced consequences; therefore, we can and must go back toward a reduction of the damages; knowledge of the materials and their consequences on the ecosystem; use of manual or technological practices that avoid intrusion, chosen in order to respect the different human, biological and geological contests in which any creative action intends to take place.	
	- Research proposals aimed at exploring, on one hand, the role of bottom-up action in heritage recognition processes, through the activation of formal and informal groups of inhabitants and other actors in the frame of wider multilevel governance, qualified by institutions and larger scale networks, also transnational; on the other hand, focusing on relations between heritage recognition processes and regulatory, strategic, planning instruments for territorial action

The research will include a period of study in the library and archive of the Centro Internazionale di Studi di Architettura Andrea Palladio / Palladium Museum of Vicenza. The results presented in the final dissertation shall be original and significant.
