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Call for the assignment of Regional Scholarships for academic year 2026/2027

Art.1 Subject of the call

The Università luav di Venezia announces a call for applications for scholarships for the 2026/2027 academic year, intended for capable and deserving students who lack financial means.

The purpose of awarding this scholarship is to help cover the living expenses sustained by students for at least ten months during each academic year

Art.2 Students who are eligible to apply for the scholarship

The regional scholarship is granted through a call for applications to:

1. Students enrolled for the **first time** and for the **first year** in a bachelor, master or a single-cycle degree program;
2. Students enrolled for the same degree program in years following the first, including those students who are about to graduate for a bachelor's degree program, and are going to enroll in a master's degree program by the deadlines;
3. Students enrolled in a PhD program (not including those who are granted of the government-funded PhD scholarship) for a period equal to the duration specified in the respective academic regulations, starting from the year of initial enrollment;

It's possible to apply for the regional scholarship for a specific number of semesters which differs depending on the degree program, starting from the year of initial enrollment at any university:

- Up to 7 semesters for a bachelor's degree program;
- Up to 5 semesters for a master's degree program;
- Up to 11 semesters for a single-cycle degree program.

For students with a **disability** equal to or above 66% and/or recognized under Law 104/1992 and for students enrolled as **part-time**, the duration of the scholarship may be extended in accordance with the provisions of Annexes 1 and 2.

Are non-eligible of the regional scholarship, students who:

- already hold a degree at a level equal to or higher than that of the course they are attending, obtained in Italy or abroad;
- have already received a scholarship for a degree program of the same level without having repaid the scholarship.

Will not be considered applications of students who:

- hold a bachelor's degree under the old system (Ministerial Decree 509/1999), unless they are enrolled in a PhD program;
- Have already been granted, for the same academic year of another scholarship, excluding grants for international mobility;
- Will not pay the first installment by the deadline.

The regional scholarship may be cumulated with other scholarships that **do not serve similar purposes and do not create any conflicts of interest**. This includes scholarships awarded by national or foreign institutions intended to supplement the recipients' training or research activities with stays abroad (e.g., mobility scholarships).

The regional scholarship is awarded to students enrolled for the **first time** in a degree program of different levels.

The **"year of first enrollment"** refers to students enrolled for the first time at any university.

The scholarship application must be submitted for each academic year.

Years of enrollment include all years during which the student was enrolled in any degree program, at this or another university, different from the one which the student is currently enrolled.

Therefore, the total years of enrollment may not necessarily coincide with the current year of enrollment.

When calculating the number of years of enrollment, any years during which studies were suspended, are not taken into account for the purpose of applying for the above benefit.

2 Kind of students

These benefits may be granted to students who meet the admission requirements for the degree program for which they are requested, regardless of how many years have passed since they earned their previous degree.

a) **Students who are enrolled in a degree program, following a previous withdrawal or termination of enrollment without having received a scholarship:**

The student is considered to be enrolling for the first time and does not carry over any years of prior enrollment in courses, effective from the date of their first enrollment, provided that the student did not receive any scholarship during their previous enrollment or, if a scholarship was received, the student waived it and returned the funds by the deadline specified in the call for applications.

Any credits earned during the student's previous enrollment period may not be counted toward merit for the purpose of awarding the scholarship during the new enrollment period.

b) **Students who are enrolled in a degree program, following a previous withdrawal or termination of enrollment who were granted of the scholarship on their previous degree program:**

The student is considered to be enrolling for years following the first and carry over any years of prior enrollment.

Any credits earned during the student's previous enrollment period may not be counted toward merit for the purpose of awarding the scholarship during the new enrollment period.

c) **Students who are enrolled in a degree program, either through internal or external transfer:**

The years of previous enrollment are added up, starting from the date of their first enrollment. Any academic credits earned during previous enrollment may be counted toward the merit criteria for the award of the scholarship only if they are recognized as part of the academic program for which the scholarship is being requested.

The degree programs referred to in Ministerial Decree No. 509/1999 are considered equivalent to bachelor's and master's degree programs, as defined in Article 3 of Ministerial Decree No. 270/2004. For this purpose, the levels of courses already completed in Italy or abroad are taken into account.

d) Students who are simultaneously enrolled in two-degree programs:

Pursuant to Law No. 33 of April 12, 2022 (Articles 1 and 2), students who enroll simultaneously in two-degree programs—whether at the same university or at different institutions, or at institutions belonging to the AFAM (Higher Education in Art, Music, and Dance)—are required to comply with the following rules to be eligible for student financial aid:

- Choice of the main degree program

Students must designate only one of the two-degree programs in which they are enrolled as their main course of study in order to be eligible for the benefits provided for by current regulations. This choice will remain binding for the entire period during which the student is simultaneously enrolled in both degree programs.

- Rules on Cumulative Eligibility and Exclusion for the Scholarship

The award of the scholarship is subject to the following conditions:

- **Prohibition on replication:** A student already enrolled in years beyond the first year may not, under any circumstances, choose a second-degree program to apply for a scholarship if they have already received (or are currently receiving) one during their first enrollment.

- **Exception for Non-Use:** If a student has never received the scholarship during their first-degree program (which must still be in progress and not have been completed with the award of a degree), they may apply for it exclusively for their second-degree program.

- Mandatory Requirements and Deadlines

To receive the scholarship and the corresponding 20% increase, students enrolled in multiple degree programs must indicate their primary degree program and complete the “Dichiarazione aggiuntiva” within one week of the publication date of the ranking list; otherwise, they will forfeit their right to the increase.

e) Inmates' students:

Inmates may apply for the scholarship based on the same criteria that apply to all the students; for the purposes of determining the scholarship amount, inmates students will be considered on-site students.

3 Scholarship Supplement:

Any student who earns a bachelor's or master's degree within the period set forth in the respective academic regulations will be eligible for a **supplement to the scholarship** equal to half of the amount received in the final year of the degree program, *provided that residual funds are available after the regional scholarship has been awarded to all eligible students enrolled in the 2026/2027 academic year.* The supplement amounts will be 50% of the scholarship amount received in the final year of the program. The calculation basis is defined according to the following specifications: the amount is considered net of the portions allocated to meal and housing services.

The allocation of available funds will be determined by establishing a merit- and income-based ranking, regulated by the following priority criteria:

1. Absolute priority is given to students who complete their degree within the regular graduation sessions.
2. Within the previous category, the ranking follows the chronological order of the final graduation exam sessions.
3. For students in the same graduation session, priority is determined based on the ISEE (Equivalent Economic Situation Indicator) value for financial aid for the right to a university education, ranked from lowest to highest.

Art.3 Requirements

1 General requirements

Students enrolled for the 2026/2027 academic year at the luav who meet the financial and academic eligibility requirements may apply for regional scholarships.

1. We will only consider students who:

a) for the 2026/2027 academic year:

- are enrolled for the first time in a bachelor's degree program;
- are enrolled for the first time in a master's degree program;
- are enrolled for the first time in a single-cycle master's degree program;
- are enrolled in years following the first of a bachelor's degree program;
- are enrolled in years following the first of a master's degree program;
- are enrolled in years following the first of a single-cycle master's degree program;
- are enrolled for the first time in a PhD program;
- are enrolled in years following the first of a PhD program.

b) have an ISEE 2026 certificate that is valid and, for subsidized benefits under the Right to Education program, either a ISEE "corrente" 2026 or an ISEE Parificato 2026, with an ISEE value not exceeding €26,306.25 and an ISPE value not exceeding €43,125.94.

c) meets the merit requirement set forth in paragraph 2 of Article 3 of this call for applications.

2. Only applications from students who meet the following criteria will be considered:

- have **paid the first installment of tuition fees** for the 2026–2027 academic year by:
 - **September 15, 2026** (only for students in enrolled in years following the first);
 - **September 30, 2026** (first-year students only);
- have an **ISEE for higher education not exceeding €26,306.25;**
- have an **ISPE not exceeding €43,125.94;**
- submitted their scholarship application through the self-certification by **September 30, 2026.**

3. Students enrolling in years following the first of bachelor's, master's, and single-cycle master's degree programs, as well as students enrolling in the second or third year of PhD programs, who have been declared eligible of the scholarship for the 2025/2026 academic year, provided that they meet all the requirements set forth in this call for applications and have submitted an application for the benefit, may pay, by 11:59 p.m. on September 30, 2026, only the regional fee for the right to university education of €192.00 and the stamp duty of €16.00.

4. If the requirements are not met, the full contribution based on income and merit will be charged.

2 Merit requirements

Students enrolled in a Bachelor's degree programmes:

- 25 credits for second year
- 80 credits for third year
- 135 credits for first off-course year. In this case the application is valid only for the first semester

Students enrolled in a Master's degree programmes:

- 30 credits for second year
- 80 credits for first off-course year. In this case the application is valid only for the first semester

Students enrolled in a Single-cycle master degree

- 25 credits for second year
- 80 credits for third year
- 135 credits for the fourth year
- 190 credits for the fifth year
- 245 credits for first off-course year.

Required credits must be obtained and registered by August 10th 2026

Merit requirements for students with disability equal or higher than 66% and for part-time students are shown in Annex 1 and 2.

3 Bonus

To reach the required number of credits, students enrolled in a three-year bachelor's degree program, a master's degree program, or a single-cycle master's degree program are eligible for a bonus in addition to the credits actually earned, provided they request it during the self-certification phase.

- from 1 to 5 credits for the second year
- from 1 to 12 credits for the third year
- from 1 to 15 credits for the last semester

Bonus **can only be used once** and it is not combinable. If you use just a part of it (for examples 3 of 5 disposable credits for the second year), you can use the remaining part for the following year.

Students enrolled in a Master's degree course may use the bonus gained and not used in the previous Italian Bachelor's degree course.

Part time students and students enrolled in the first year of a master's degree program with an admission title obtained abroad don't have access to any bonus.

4 Special cases

1. Students **who have previously withdrawn** from university studies:

- In case they **did not benefit from scholarship**: they are considered as first year students. Any approved credits from previously closed academic career are not included in merit calculation.
- In case they **benefited from scholarship**: they are considered as students enrolled in years following the first and years of previous career are also counted.

For **international students**, only years of enrollment and course credits obtained since first enrollment in Italy are counted.

Art.4 How and when to apply

1 How

1. Request the specific ISEE 2026 certificate for “subsidized benefits for the right to a university education”

- How to submit the DSU (Single Substitute Declaration):
 - Through a Tax Assistance Center (CAF)
 - Independently, directly online on the INPS website

2. On your personal web area SPIN, **fill out the on-line self-certification form** with the request for scholarship, student collaboration and tuition fees for academic year 2026/2027.

- You do not need to be enrolled to fill out the online self-certification form; you can access it using the login credentials you received when the pre-enrollment was issued
- If the procedure is completed correctly, you will receive an email confirming that your application has been submitted, along with a PDF summary of the benefits requested

3. Pay the first tuition fees installment for academic year 2026/27 by the deadline stated at article 3 comma 1.

• **Which ISEE should you apply for:**

Any ISEE certificate required should not be sent directly to the university, as the university shall acquire it directly from the INPS database, upon authorization granted by the applicant in the self-certification form.

○ **ISEE FOR THE RIGHT TO UNIVERSITY EDUCATION**

The University may only accept the ISEE issued for Subsidized University Education Benefits in the name of the applicant (if there are multiple students from the same household, the tax codes of all applicants must be provided); this ISEE must be currently valid.

The student is also required to verify that the ISEE certificate does not contain any notes regarding omissions or discrepancies. If there are omissions or discrepancies resulting from an incorrect completion of the Dichiarazione Sostitutiva Unica (DSU), a new DSU must be submitted, including the information previously omitted or incorrectly stated, by the specified deadlines.

○ **ISEE CORRENTE**

It is an indicator calculated based on an ISEE issued for financial aid for the right to a higher education, but based on income from the past twelve months, may be requested in the event of unforeseen circumstances (for example: job loss, a significant change in household income, etc.).

The current ISEE can be requested **only if the conditions set forth in the applicable legislation are met** (for more information, consult the relevant INPS web pages or contact a CAF or a professional).

In any case, the corresponding DSU must be signed by **September 30, 2026**.

○ **ISEE PARIFICATO**

This is a different type of certification required for:

- international students residing abroad, whose household resides abroad;
- international students residing in Italy, but with an income from employment below €9,000.00 and whose household resides abroad;
- Italian students residing abroad, whether or not they are registered with the Registry of Italians Residing Abroad (AIRE).

The ISEE Parificato **must be requested exclusively from the CAF affiliated with the University**; references are available at www.iuav.it/it/diritto-allo-studio/isee-parificato

2 When

- **By 30th of September:**

Even students who enroll late must meet the September 30, 2026, deadline for completing the self-certification form and submitting the DSU.

Failure to meet even one of these deadlines will result in exclusion from the scholarship competition.

3 Exceptions

International and Italian students with foreign income and assets have to **provide ISEE parificato IPU**. Only for these students the deadline for request and documents submission to the affiliated CAF with luav is postponed to **10th of October 2026**

Deadlines of **first installment payment** is postponed to **December 18th** only for:

- Students transferred to luav University;
- Students enrolled in master's degree programs who, as of **September 30 are in the process of completing their previous bachelor degree**;
- Students who are on study suspension, interruption or are attending Italian community service during the opening of the application;
- Students who are suffering from verifiable severe illness during the opening of the application.

Failure to complete or incorrect completion of even one of the steps listed above—including failure to pay the first installment of the contribution by the deadline—will result in exclusion from the scholarship competition.

Art.5 Rankings and funds allocation

1 There are 4 rankings:

- 1) Italian and EU students enrolled in **first year** of Bachelor's degree programmes and all students enrolled in first year of Master's degree programmes and PhD: the ranking is in **ascending order of ISEE/IPU value**.
- 2) Non-EU students enrolled in first year of Bachelor's degree programmes and all students enrolled in first year of Master's degree programmes and PhD: the ranking is in **ascending order of ISEE/IPU value**
- 3) Students enrolled in **years following the first**: the ranking is in **ascending order of merit coefficient**
- 4) PhD students enrolled in years following the first: the ranking is in **ascending order of ISEE/IPU value**

2 Available funds are shared out as follows:

- 1) First year students: 30%
- 2) First year non-EU students: 7% of 30% intended for first year students
- 3) Students enrolled in years following the first: 70%
- 4) PhD students enrolled in years following the first: specific provision determined by the ratio of previous year eligible students to the total of enrolled students

3 Funds from which resources cover the scholarships are drawn are from:

- a) the revenue of the regional fee;

- b) any share of the State supplementary fund, as established in the D.Lgs. n. 68/2012;
- c) any resources owned by the Veneto Region, as established in the D.Lgs. n. 68/2012;

As stated in the **Art. 7, comma 1, of the d.lgs. n. 68 of March 29th, 2012**, the granting of scholarships is ensured to all students who meet the eligibility requirements, within the limits of the resources available in the budget of the State under current legislation.

Art. 6 Merit assessment

The merit coefficient is calculated with the following formula:

$$[(\text{CREDITS OF THE STUDENT} - \text{REFERENCE CREDITS}) + (\text{GRADE OF THE STUDENT} - \text{REFERENCE GRADE})]/2$$

The reference grade is given by the average of all students' grades in the same year and for the same disciplines of the student taken into account.

The amount of reference credits is given by the average of credits registered by August 10th 2026 by all the students enrolled during the same number of years and in the same course of study of the student taken into account.

The first position in the ranking correspond to the higher merit coefficient. In case of a tie, the lower ISEE/IPU value prevails.

Art. 7 Economic conditions assessment

1 Student's economic condition is identified on the basis of the equivalent financial situation indicator (ISEE), equivalent asset situation indicator (ISPE) and foreign equivalent financial situation indicator (IPU). The declaration must be specifically released for the benefits for the right to academic study.

2 Economic conditions of international students coming from **particularly poor countries**, listed in D.M. 176 of 24th of February 2026, can be identified on the basis of a certificate that states that they don't belong to a high social level and high family income. The declaration can be released by:

- a) Italian embassy in the country of provenance
- b) Home country University when affiliated with luav
- c) Italian entitled agencies

3 Political refugees and stateless students: if any, we only consider Italian income and assets, with following the same procedures as for other students.

4 Students from countries affected by conflict or in which Italian diplomatic authorities have announced a temporary closure of their offices (as indicated on the MAECI's official website) may submit a **simplified declaration** issued by **Foreign diplomatic authorities in Italy**, which includes information regarding family composition, financial situation, and assets held abroad. The documentation must be **translated and legalized** in accordance with current regulations at the Prefettura - Ufficio territoriale del Governo (Italian Prefecture).

5 Families who faced the worsening of economic conditions can submit ISEE "corrente", only if they already have submitted ISEE 2026.

6 Student's family unit is set according to the D.P.C.M. n°159 of December 5th, 2013.

7 Students can be considered **independent from their family unit** when:

- a) They have been **residing outside of their family house** for at least **2 years** and have been declaring at least **9.000 € of their own income** to tax authorities in the last **2 years**.

b) They are enrolled in PhD and complies with the previous condition

8 The family unit of the PhD student consists of the student and, if present, the partner and children who are younger than 18 and older, according to the Art. 3 of the D.M. N.159/2013.

Art.8 On site, commuter and off-site student

1 When filling out the self-certification, the students must indicate their status (on-site, commuter, or off-site), according to the following indications:

- a) **On site:** student residing in the same municipality or surrounding area of the course's location
- b) **Commuter:** students residing in a place that is between **40km and 80 km away from the course's location** and/or have a commute time of **between 40 and 80 minutes**;
- c) **Off-site:** students residing in place that is more than 80 km from the courses location and therefore rents an accommodation in Venice Municipality or surrounding area (municipalities classified as "on-site")

- Rental Requirements for "Off-site" Status

Eligibility for "Off-site" status is subject to compliance with the minimum lease term during the 2026/2027 academic year (the academic year goes from **October 2026 to September 2027**):

- **Students on their regular academic schedule:** A lease agreement with a minimum term of 10 months.
- **6-month scholarship recipients:** A lease agreement with a minimum duration of 5 months.

Extensions and Calculation of Months: Periods spent abroad for international exchange programs or curricular internships are considered valid for the purpose of meeting the minimum required months, provided they are covered by a valid, paid lease agreement.

- Provision for exclusion, exceptions, and downgrading:

- **Ph.D. students:** Students enrolled in a Ph.D. program are automatically classified as "off-site," regardless of their registered place of residence.
- **Reclassification as a Commuter:** In case of the failure to provide a paid lease agreement or if the minimum number of months required (10 or 5 months, depending on the circumstances) is not met, the student will automatically be classified as a Commuter.
- **Geographical Incompatibility:** If the student's municipality of residence is already classified in the official tables as "On-Campus" or "Commuter" in relation to the course location, "Off-Campus" status cannot be granted, regardless of whether a valid rental agreement is submitted.

- Tools for verification and reference

Official schedules: The exact classification of your municipality of residence must be verified by consulting the geographic schedules available on the dedicated webpage.

- **Eligible municipalities for accommodation:** Within these same tables, you can find the list of "on-site" municipalities where it is legally valid to rent paid housing in order to obtain "off-site" status.
- **Geographical reference:** Please note that the distance and travel time parameters included in the official tables **refer exclusively to the Venice campus**.

2 Independent student

The scholarship is awarded with the off-site status, regardless of the municipality of residence if the student:

- has been living outside the household of their family of origin for **at least two years**, as of the date of submission of the DSU, in a residence not owned by a family member, in a paid-rental arrangement for a period of no less than ten months,
- earns their own income from employment or similar sources, which has been reported for tax purposes for at least two years, amounting to no less than €9,000.00 per year.

In the absence of paid housing for the required minimum number of months, the student is considered on-site or commuter.

Students who have declared that they meet the requirements for “independent student” status must send the following documentation to diritto.studio@iuav.it:

- a lease agreement and appropriate documentation proving their residence;
- their own income from employment or similar sources, which has been reported for tax purposes for at least **two years**, amounting to no less than €9,000.00 per year.

3 Rental Agreement

1 Students who have declared that they meet the “off-site” requirements in the **online self-certification form** for the scholarship application must upload all required documentation attesting the student's status as a tenant in paid housing that the student will occupy for a total of at least 10 months during the academic year (5 months or until graduation in the case of an “additional” final semester) in the dedicated form accessible via the link

it has to be filled out once during one of these two periods:

- **from July 31, 2026, until 12:00 PM on October 9, 2026,**

to verify the correct assignment of “Off-site” status in the final rankings of December 2026

- **from October 15 until 12:00 PM on November 15, 2026,**

to verify the correct assignment of “Off-site” status in the reformulated rankings

Students who reside in a municipality considered “Off-site” and who declared themselves as such during the online self-certification process will, if they have not uploaded the required documentation by **October 9, 2026**, be considered “Off-site” subject to verification and will receive the first installment of their scholarship as “Commuters.” Only after the required documentation has been uploaded and approved will any additional portion of the scholarship be paid following the publication of the reformulated rankings.

Female students enrolled in STEM programs enrolled in years following the first who, as of **October 9, 2026**, have not uploaded the required documentation will receive any supplementary funding following the Region’s approval of the status changes. Approval is expected in **July 2027**.

4 Revocation and Reclassification of the “off-site” Status

Failure to submit documentation proving eligibility for “off-site” status by the strict deadline set for the second period will result in the automatic revocation of “off-site” student status. Consequently, the scholarship will be automatically reclassified as “Commuter” or “On-site” status, resulting in a recalculation and reduction of the amount due, with no possibility of further exemptions or retroactive corrections.

5 Application for the accommodation subsidy

You must complete the accommodation subsidy form in every section and attach the following required documentation:

- **Private housing in Italy**
 - Copy of a valid lease agreement (signed by both parties)
 - Copy of the registration receipt from the Agenzia delle Entrate (including, if applicable, documentation regarding extensions, cessations, terminations, or takeovers). Extensions and/or takeovers will not be accepted without the original registration to which they refer.
- **Housing at a college**
 - Copy of the housing contract, including the period and cost of tuition
- **Housing at ESU**
 - Copy of the lease agreement signed directly with ESU
- **Private housing abroad (for those participating in international mobility programs)**
 - Copy of the current lease agreement duly signed by both parties (if already in your possession);
 - Copy of the international mobility contract/agreement
- **Identification document**
 - Copy of your ID;

6 Contract Renewal, Takeover, and Extension:

In the event of a takeover, or the expiration and subsequent extension of a lease agreement during the academic year, and after the form submission deadline has passed, students who have already completed and uploaded all required documentation by the specified deadlines must submit the registration receipt for the takeover or extension (issued by the Agenzia delle Entrate) to the email address diritto.studio@iuav.it.

This documentation must be submitted - under penalty of disqualification from the benefit - within the strict deadline of **30 days** from the date of the lease transfer or the expiration of the previous lease, and in any case no later than **March 10, 2027**.

7 Student Responsibilities, Verification, and Reasons for losing the off-site Status

It is students' responsibility to ensure that the attached documentation is complete and legible. Failure to submit the lease agreement and the documentation listed above, submission via methods other than those specified above, submission after the aforementioned deadlines, or submission of incomplete or illegible documentation will result in the automatic assignment of on-site or commuter student status.

Particular cases (ESU and Erasmus)

- **ESU Housing Awardees:** Students who applied for the ESU housing program and have been awarded a housing spot in an ESU residence are still required to submit, via the designated Google form, a copy of the housing assignment agreement signed with ESU.
- **Erasmus Mobility Awardees:** Students who have been awarded an international mobility grant and are staying in private housing abroad must submit, again via the Google form, a copy of the mobility contract/international agreement and the foreign lease agreement (if already in their possession).

8 Changes During the Academic Year, Loss of Eligibility, and Penalties:

Students are required to promptly report any changes that occur during the academic year regarding the requirements necessary to determine their status. If a student is found not to meet the specified requirements - including as a result of any early termination or a takeover that occurred during the academic year - the student forfeits any benefits received and is required not only to repay any amounts unduly received but also to pay the assessment fee and the associated administrative penalty.

9 False Statements

Please note that anyone who makes false statements, creates fraudulent documents, or uses such documents is subject to punishment under the Penal Code and relevant special laws.

10 Verification and Reporting of Irregularities

Students are encouraged, once the provisional rankings have been published, to report anomalies or errors using the **designated appeal form** no later than the specified deadlines.

The statuses will be verified and, where necessary, corrected by the Diritto allo Studio Office in the event of irregularities, even after the publication of the final rankings.

Art.9 Scholarship amount

1 Scholarship amounts for the 2026/2027 academic year are:

- a) Off-site or independent student: 7.171,11 €
- b) Commuter student: 4.190,71 €
- c) On site student: 2.890,16 €

11. Scholarship Amount for Students Enrolled in PhD Programs:

Students enrolled in the PhD program are considered **off-site**. The scholarship is subject to mandatory contributions of **1,600.00 euros** for housing and **760.00 euros** for the canteen service, regardless of other circumstances. The scholarship amount is subject to the increases provided for in Article 9, paragraph 4, of this call for applications.

12. Scholarship Amount for Independent Students

19 Eligible students not granted with the scholarship due to lack of resources, as defined in Art. 11, comma 4, of D.P.C.M 09/04/2001, enrolled in **the freshman year** and students enrolled in **years after the first who meet the income requirement and 70% of the merit requirement**, have access to the food service at a discounted price.

Art.11 Payment

1 Students **granted** of the scholarship may receive the amounts by using luav card. As an alternative, students can upload the IBAN of a **personal** bank account on their SPIN area.

Other payments methods are not available.

The student, within 6 months of the grant award, must notify the bank account in which the scholarship will be disbursed.

To enter or modify the details of the bank account, the student must access the dedicated area of his/her SPIN: **Dati Anagrafici > Anagrafica > Modifica dati rimborso.**

2 Dates of payments:

- December 2026: **first instalment** for **granted (assegnatari)** students
- December 2026: **full scholarship** for PhD **granted** students
- June 2027: **second instalment** for first-year **granted** students who obtained at least 20 credits by **May 15th 2027**
- June 2027: second instalment for **granted** students enrolled in years following the first
- September 2027: second instalment for first-year beneficiary students who obtained at least 20 credits by **August 10th 2027**

First-year granted students who fail in obtaining at least 20 credits by August 10th 2027 won't receive the second instalment of the scholarship.

Art.12 Exemption from tuition fees

1 **Granted (assegnatari)** and **eligible (idonei)** students are **exempted from the payment of tuition fees and the regional fee.**

Refunds are made by the end of the academic year 2026/2027

Art.13 Revocation of the scholarship

1 Scholarship is revoked when:

- First year students don't obtain at least **20 credits** by **November 30th 2027**
- Part-time first year students don't obtain at least **10 credits** by **November 30th 2027**;
- First supplementary year students who graduate by last graduation session of the 2025/2026 academic year;
- Students who withdrawal from studies before **August the 10th 2027**;
- Student who transfers to another University before **August the 10th 2027**;
- Those who make false statements;
- PhD students without a research grant who subsequently become granted of the research grant due to the L. 210/98

2 In case of revocation, scholarship must be returned according to times and ways luav will communicate.

3 In case of revocation students will have to pay the **Regional fee** and tuition fees for the 2026/2027 academic year, recalculated based on their ISEE value and the merit.

4 The date of November 30th 2027 can be postponed to March 31st 2027 only in case of severe and documented illness.

5 Students who graduate by the last graduation session of the 2025/2026 academic year must return the scholarship **before the graduation date.**

6 The amount received and the amount relating to accommodation and catering (based on what has been used), must be refunded, calculated at the corresponding rates without requirements.

Art.14 Additional subsidies for International Mobility

1 In case of available regional funds, beneficiary and eligible students taking part in International Mobility programmes during academic year 2026/2027, can benefit from an additional Regional subsidy, when credits obtained abroad are recognized from luav.

2 Order of allocation

1. Eligible, but not granted students, according to ranking position;
2. Students granted of scholarship, according to ranking position;
3. Students who, in the 2026–2027 academic year, meet the academic eligibility requirements for a scholarship but whose household income exceeds the limits set for scholarship eligibility. In this case, students must submit an application for financial assistance, meet the academic merit requirements set forth in Article 3, paragraph 2, and have a household income that does not exceed 40% of the thresholds specified in Article 2, paragraphs 1 and 2, of this call for applications (ISEE of €36,828.75 and ISPE of €60,376.3).

It is not necessary to submit a specific application for these grants; it is sufficient to have requested tuition reductions and/or benefits by completing the online self-certification form and submitting the 2026 ISEE within the deadlines applicable to all students.

The grant is not available to those who receive a PhD scholarship.

3 Amount:

- Students granted or eligible of the scholarship: € 500,00 for each month of international mobility, for a maximum of 10 months;
- In addition to the integration for those identified in the previous section, upon presentation of the original travel documents, there will also be reimbursement of round-trip travel expenses: up to 100 euros for European countries and up to 500 euros for non-European countries.
- For those who meet the merit requirements and the financial eligibility requirements - which do not exceed 40% of those set forth in Article 5, paragraphs 1 and 2, of this call for applications (ISEE of €36,828.75 and ISPE of €60,376.3) - there will be only the regional supplement of €125.00 for each month spent abroad, for a maximum of 10 months.

The amount of the scholarship granted with European Union funds or with funds coming from other agreements, including non-EU agreements, is deducted from the total amount of the regional supplement.

4 Payment is made in two instalments: 40% of the total amount before the start of the mobility period or when it has started provided that the Region allocates the necessary resources to the University by July 31, 2027; the final installment covering any remaining balance and round-trip travel expenses, up to the amounts specified in paragraph 3 of this article, will be disbursed within 50 days of the end of the mobility period, subject to verification that the expected results have been achieved and upon submission of the relevant supporting documentation to the Diritto allo studio Office.

5 If the student fails to achieve the planned goals of the mobility (e.g., failure to take exams or complete educational activities agreed upon with the local exchange

coordinator), the initial installment awarded to the student as described in the preceding paragraph must be returned by the student to the University within 30 days of notification by the Diritto allo studio Office.
